Sermon: Spiritual Blessings in Christ (Ephesians 1:3–14)

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

We begin the new year with the revelation of the Christ child.

Epiphany is all about light. The star in the sky leads the magi to Jesus, the light of the world, the revelation of divine love who came to dwell among us.

Let us take a moment to consider the role darkness plays in helping us notice the light—the darkness that helps regulate our sleep-wake rhythms, the darkness that draws us into a state of calm and peace. The magi noticed the star's light in the dark of the night. Darkness is needed to be able to follow the light.

Like the magi, we have wandered over the last year, sometimes across rough terrain and other times over smooth roads, to seek the promise that God is doing a new thing among us. When we renew our covenant together, we commit once again to continue on the path of the Christ child throughout the coming year. We choose to see, hear, touch, smell, and even taste the world around us as bearers and seekers of divine love.

The Prayer Before He Leaves

Rev Adrian Ng | John 17

Summary | "Now this is eternal life; that they know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom You have sent." (v3)

The longest prayer by Jesus as recorded in John 17 reveals what was fundamentally crucial to Him before He was betrayed and crucified. It should cause us, as we end the year, to reflect on how we are to worship Immanuel in whose loving, compassionate presence we have received mercy and every good thing.

Jesus Prayed for His Disciples (v6-19) – They were precious to Him for they belonged to His Father who had entrusted them to Him to groom and grow as His disciples and missionaries. Having spent much time with Jesus, they were closest to Him and understood His Ministry. As they would remain in a hostile world that rejects His Word, Jesus asked His Father to protect them from the evil one so that none will be lost. Jesus prayed empowerment over His disciples who had accepted and obeyed His teachings as coming from the Father. He prayed for them to remain lovingly united as one, to be led always by God's truth and only His truth – which would sanctify them to continue the unfinished work of outreach He had for them.

Everything we have comes from God to glorify His name and to partner Christ in furthering God's eternal kingdom. Covered with God's sanctifying love, we are protected and enabled to serve as one people in His church with joyful perseverance – so that many more may come to experience the love of Christ. The discipleship of sharpening and supporting one another at Wesley has been fruitful. Over the years, many within her walls and outside have been encouraged with Hope through opportunities to worship, listen to faith talks, and be equipped with skills training. Migrant workers, seniors, shut-ins, incarcerated inmates, the diversely needy, lost and least in society, here and in neighbouring countries, have been blessed to belong and believe in Christ as Saviour of the World. Jesus continues to pray for His disciples today in ministries that embody the Great Commission – including Witness & Evangelism, Christian Outreach & Social Concerns, Missions, Crisis Relief, Alpha, Creative Expressions, Sports, Hospitality, and Marketplace Ministries.

Jesus Prayed for All Believers (v20-26) – This prayer segment reveals the Lord's heartbeat for all believers in His community. He desired for them to

- Remain united as one church – Having received the Good News from His disciples, believers today can take the next step to follow after Christ with thankful hearts. With the Father's love in them, they too can make God's house of worship at Wesley a welcoming, missional and caring community, sited on a hill to shine His light upon the city. Jesus prayed for every abiding believer to be with Him in heaven. This same prayer applies to us today.

- Continue to make God's love known through the way they love one another – Abiding in Christ, believers grow to love each other with the Father's love in them. Caring friendships build over time when they participate actively as a congregation. Through faithful worship and personal discipleship, they too will be in 'complete unity' – and the world will see and know that the Father who sent His beloved Son loves them with that same love.

Jesus Prayed for Himself (v1-5) – The Son brought glory to the Father by finishing the work He was given to do on earth. By His authority, miracles, signs and wonders many who were in His presence found God and were transformed. Jesus prayed to be glorified in His Father's presence with the glory given Him before the creation of the world! He prayed for the Father's protection as He embarked on His next step of obedience to the cross. His profound intimate relationship with His Father and constant prayers clearly show He was faithfully fulfilling the will of His Father.

By God's infinite grace and protection, we become faithful witnesses and living testimonies of His transforming power and miraculous interventions in our lives. Following in Jesus' model of prayer, we too can bring our personal petitions and thanksgiving to God. May our prayers now and in the new year lead us to

- Reflect on God's amazing love
- Recommit our living for Jesus
- Be sanctified by His Word
- Desire that others will know we are Christians by our love for God and one another, and be led to receive eternal life by knowing the only true God through Jesus Christ

Keep On Keeping On!

Rev Benjamin Lau | Hebrews 12:1-2

Summary | An avid runner, Pastor Ben began by sharing his experience completing a full marathon 15 years ago. What sustained him through the long race was a simple yet powerful resolve: keep on keeping on. Hebrews 12:1-2, which he memorised and wrote on his bib, reminded him that life is more like a marathon than a sprint.

The journey of life and faith requires mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual endurance. Along the way, there are moments of joy and celebration, but also seasons of discouragement and sorrow. What keeps us going when the road feels long and uncertain is fixing our eyes on the right prize – Jesus. He reminded the church: “We persevere not by our own strength, but by God’s grace.” As the church enters a new season, four lessons from Hebrews 12:1-2 were shared to help us run well.

1. KNOW the Race Marked Out for Us (v.1b)

The first question we must ask is whether we are running the right race. It is possible to be very busy and expend much energy, yet move in the wrong direction. As Thomas Merton observed, many spend their lives climbing the ladder of success only to discover it is leaning against the wrong wall. None of us wants to reach the end and realise we have pursued the wrong finishing line. The choices we make each day; what we say “yes” to and what we say “no” to, shape the path we walk and determine the race we are truly running.

Jesus has clearly marked out this race. In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus commissions all His followers, not just church leaders, to make disciples of all nations. We run under His authority and with His promised presence. It is not a solo effort, nor an attempt to prove ourselves to God, but a response of obedience to His call. Once we are clear about the race God has set before us, the challenge becomes learning how to keep going when the journey grows long, tiring, and discouraging, and when we are tempted to slow down or give up.

2. LOOK at the Champions of Faith (v.1a)

Hebrews 12:1 begins, “Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses...”. One way we grow in perseverance is by learning from the godly men and women who have gone before us. Hebrews 11, often called the “Hall of Faith,” records ordinary people in Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Moses, and others who trusted an extraordinary God and were commended for their faith, even though they did not receive all that was promised. This was likened to running a marathon, where many runners “hit the wall” and feel exhausted. During Pastor Ben’s own race, as he passed Marina Barrage and heard the cheers of the crowd, he was reminded of this “great cloud of witnesses”; the saints of the past cheering us on to keep running.

Scripture was given to encourage us. Romans 15:4 reminds us that what was written before was meant to teach us endurance and give us hope. We learn not only from the saints of old, but also from faithful believers today. God has placed godly men and women around us to encourage us and model Christlikeness. Pastor Ben gave thanks for the many “champions of faith” in Wesley Methodist Church; leaders, staff, volunteers, small group leaders, and faithful members whose quiet, sacrificial service inspires us to keep running and spur one another on.

3. LAY Aside Every Hindrance (v.1b)

Hebrews 12:1 calls us to “throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles.” To run well, we must examine our lives honestly: what distractions, habits, or sins are slowing us or drawing us away from God? Just as athletes carefully manage their training and diet, we must be intentional about what we allow into our lives. As we prepare for the coming year, we need to reprioritise our time and lay aside anything that hinders our walk with God. Where there is sin, we are invited to confess it and receive God’s forgiveness and cleansing (1 John 1:9).

True surrender means depending on God, not ourselves. The Wesley Covenant Prayer, often prayed during Watch Night Services; “I am no longer my own, but Yours...” expresses a life fully surrendered to Him.

4. FIX Our Eyes on Jesus (v.2a)

Finally, we are called to fix our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. He is both the starting point and the finishing goal of our race. Like a runner focusing on markers along the route, we keep going by continually fixing our gaze on Christ.

Jesus endured far more than any hero of faith and faithfully completed the work God gave Him. Challenges in life are inevitable, but the key question is whether we look at ourselves or to Jesus when they come. As the Chief Shepherd, He alone leads us to eternal hope and shows us how to live as faithful disciples.

Parting Words

This was Pastor Ben’s final sermon at Wesley Methodist Church before moving to Living Waters Methodist Church. He expressed deep gratitude to the Wesley family; his home church where he and his children were baptised and nurtured in faith. He thanked all who supported him and his wife, Claire, through his calling and service. Reflecting on his time in the NextGen ministry, he noted that true ministry depends on keeping our eyes on Jesus, not on our own strength.

As he prepares to serve a smaller congregation with a large student mission field at ACS(I), he acknowledged the uncertainties ahead but trusted in God’s perfect plan. He will miss Wesley, a church of “champions of faith,” and looks forward to seeing how God continues His work there.

His final encouragement: fix your eyes on the Chief Shepherd, be strong and courageous, and trust in God’s abiding presence. This is not goodbye, but until we meet again.





CHRISTIAN BELIEVER

Knowing God with Heart and Mind



- *Have you ever found it challenging to explain your faith?*
- *Do you wish to better understand your Christian belief?*

CHRISTIAN BELIEVER, a study of Christian doctrines, that is, what the church believes and teaches, may assist in deepening your understanding of the Christian faith.

The Christian Believer study

- focuses on classical teachings of the Christian faith, presenting and interpreting them in a way that participants can understand through the use of words, symbols and hymns
- draws on Scripture to receive what God has revealed
- read and study historical creeds, prayers, hymns and selected writings from several Christian authors like Augustine, Karl Barth, John Calvin, Martin Luther and John Wesley
- Your key texts are the Bible, Study Manual and Book of Readings (which comprises key statements of Christian writings from theologians and church council).

Requirements

- Although you will be reading Scripture, this is NOT strictly Bible Study. This is a study of biblical doctrines that requires a good understanding of the Bible.
- Eligible participants are expected to have graduated from **a minimum of 3 DISCIPLE Bible Study phases**.
- 32 Weekly Sessions via ZOOM
- Be prepared to commit at least 45 minutes each day, six days a week, for reading and studying, taking notes and prayer.
- Your key texts are the Bible, Study Manual and Book of Readings (which comprises key statements of Christian writings from theologians and church council).

Overview of Revelation (D)

*The Tribulation (Rev 4-19)

Rev 11: The Two Witnesses: John was given a reed to measure the **temple of God**, the **altar** and its **worshippers**. The outer court was excluded because it had been given to the **Gentiles**, who would trample on the holy city for **42 months**. God will appoint **2 Witnesses** ("2 olive trees and 2 lampstands" that stand before the Lord of the earth). They will have power to devour their enemies with **fire**, stop the **rain**, turn waters into **blood** and strike the earth with **plagues**.

NB: This **temple** will be in Jerusalem during the 7-year Tribulation. God measures/takes note of the faithful **worshippers**. The miraculous ministry of the 2 Witnesses will extend for **1,260 days/42 weeks/3.5 years**. (during the 1st half of Tribulation). Their powers resemble those of Elijah (fire, rain) and Moses (blood, plagues).

When they have "finished" their testimony, the beast (Anti-Christ) from the Abyss will kill them. Their bodies will lie in the public square/street of the "great city" (Jerusalem) for 3.5 days, where people from **every language/nation** will gloat over them, sending one another **gifts**, in **celebration**. But after 3.5 days, **God** will give them **life** and they will stand up, and in response to a "loud voice" from heaven saying "**Come up here**", they will go up to heaven in "the" (not "a") cloud /glory of God, while their terrified enemies looked on!

At that very hour, a **severe earthquake** occurred and 1/10th of Jerusalem collapsed, killing 7,000 people. The terrified **survivors gave glory to God**.

NB: (1) **God's obedient servants** are **immortal/invincible** till their work is done. Only when **God permits**, they were killed and the **whole world** gloated over their bodies (eg.TV, social media, accessible to billions), celebrating with gifts! (an "AntiChrist"-mas celebration. The only celebration mentioned in the Tribulation). After 3.5 days, with their terrified enemies looking on, 2 dead bodies rose to their feet and ascended to heaven, in "a/the" cloud of glory, in response to **God's call**. Believers are assured of **vindication** by God and should **listen for God's voice/commands**. (End of 2nd Woe)

(2) **God was glorified!** But will all **repent and believe/trust in Christ**?

Rev 11: The 7th Trumpet: When sounded, loud voices in heaven announced that the world had become the **Kingdom of Christ who will reign forever**. The 24 elders worshiped God and thanked Him for:

- (1) reigning over **all nations** (which were angry, wanting their own way)
- (2) judging the (wicked) dead and rewarding His **servants/prophets** and those who revere Him (**righteous**), both **great and small** (irrespective of **status, wealth**...)
- (3) destroying those who **destroy the earth**.

Then **God's temple in heaven** was opened and the **Ark of His Covenant** was seen, inside it! – followed by lightning, thunder, earthquake and hailstorm.**

** (Reminiscent of the **Presence of God** at Mt Sinai!) (Exod 19:16-19)

NB: (3rd Woe) **The 7th Trumpet brought 3 significant events.**

- (1) **Announcement of Imminent Reign of Christ (over the world)**
- (2) **Praise of the Elders**
- (3) **Assurance of God's Presence/Faithfulness (Appearance of Ark)**

***Christ**, rules **today** over a **spiritual kingdom** (in the hearts of true believers). In future, He will reign supremely, over the **nations** of the world, with a **rod of iron**. (Psalm 2:9: with Absolute Authority, resulting in **worldwide Peace, Plenty, and Divine Justice**.) (I.e. The **answer** to (your) **prayer**: "Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on Earth as it is in heaven.") (Matt 6:10) This is when God reclaims His Creation from Satan. (Rev 12:22)

Wesley WSCS

*Those who "destroy the earth":

(1) **physically:** neglect responsible stewardship, and exploit/mismanage the Earth's **God-given** resources.

Result: Air/water pollution, climate change, global warming... loss of biodiversity/soil health, deforestation... which deprive current and future generations of natural resources for sustaining life! **Yet** many who care for the environment/the Earth, do not "care" to acknowledge its **Creator!**

(2) **morally:** introduce **corruption of minds** with superstitions, idolatry, false teachings; **corruption of bodies** with immoral practices; **violence**; **where every intent of the heart was evil.** (Gen 6:5)

*The Tabernacle was a "copy" of the Temple in heaven. (Heb 9:23)

(1) The **Ark** contains **God's Law** (The **10 Commandments**) which would have been neglected during the AntiChrist's/beast's influence during the first 3.5 years of Tribulation, when the 2 Witnesses were preaching.

(2) The **Ark's Mercy Seat** (cover/lid) is where the sacrificial blood was sprinkled on the Day of Atonement, for the forgiveness of sins.

(3) The **Ark** reminds believers of **God's Presence and Faithfulness.** Its appearance indicates that access to **God (Holy of Holies)** is open to the **Faithful Followers of Christ.** This reminder comes just before the final judgment events of the 7th Trumpet, giving believers, assurance.

Rev 12: The Woman: A great sign appeared in heaven:

*A woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. (**Israel**)

*She gave birth to a son, a male child, who "will rule all the nations with an iron sceptre." (**Messiah! Jesus! Christ!**)

*And her child was snatched up to God and to his throne. (**Ascension**)

(Welcome to our world! * Praise the Lord, for Your victory!)
