Biblical Justice 2: Justice In The Testaments – From Old To New

Rev Lilian Ang | Deuteronomy 15:1-11; Luke 14:12-14

Summary | The second sermon in the Biblical Justice Sermon Series looks at scripture evidence for justice in the Old and New Testaments. Deuteronomy 15 gives instructions for cancelling debts and caring for the poor, while Luke 14:12-14 is Jesus' call for radical hospitality and justice to the marginalised. In *Generous Justice*, Timothy Keller refers to biblical justice as a gracious and generous justice empowered by our experience of grace. Bible Project's video on Justice defines Righteousness as treating others with the innate dignity that all God's people deserve, while Justice refers to restoring and meeting the needs of the vulnerable. God's justice is more than fairness; it is about faithfulness to His covenant and restoration of broken people and systems. Justice is woven into God's covenant relationship with His people and is central to Jesus' mission. It calls for radical generosity, inconvenient compassion and faithful action.

A. Justice in the Old Testament (Deuteronomy 15:1-11)

Deuteronomy 15 provides instruction for the Year of Release – a system of caring for the needy in Israel. It depicts a community of justice where God's people help the poor until their need is eliminated. This law commanded Israel to cancel debts every seven years and care for the poor.

Justice is restoring right relationships between people and with God. Justice is always rooted in redemption. The point of Israel's laws (on gleaning, debt release, land return) was to remind them how God has freed them from slavery, hence they were to model God's freedom and generosity. Justice reorders our view of ownership of our resources. It teaches us to generously release our resources to God with open hands and ensure that others have enough.

Many other passages in the Old Testament also advocate justice.

1. The Prophets denounced empty worship that neglected social justice (Amos 5:21-24). Justice involves advocacy for the marginalised, vulnerable and powerless (Isaiah 1:17). Justice is a lifestyle, not only a law. It reflects God's nature and requires faithfulness to God's heart.
2. The Mosaic Law has many provisions to protect the poor, foreigner, widow, and orphan. (Leviticus 19:15; Deuteronomy 24:17-22) It reflects a society based on equity and compassion, with laws for structural and ethical justice.
3. Wisdom literature emphasises that justice is a moral commitment that pleases God and strengthens community. It requires personal integrity and social ethics (Psalm 82:3-4; Proverbs 31:8-9).

B. Justice in the New Testament (Luke 14:12-14)

Jesus broadens the scope of justice in the New Testament. Instead of cancelling debts every seven years, He cancelled sin at the cross and shows us unlimited hospitality at His eternal feast. Jesus reveals the character of Kingdom justice: to invite those that society has forgotten and show radical generosity. Because this is what God has done for us in Christ!

Jesus' justice restores dignity and belonging. It is transformational hospitality without expecting reciprocity. There are four characteristics of Biblical Justice:

1. Not transactional – it is radically generous and non-reciprocal. It calls for sacrificial care and integrity to do the right thing when there is no extrinsic benefit.
2. Uplifts the marginalised – because Jesus sees their need and has special compassion for them.
3. Imitates God's generosity – because God generously invites the undeserving.
4. Disrupts social norms – Jesus' Kingdom values disrupt comfort. They call for radical inclusion and faithful love in action to the marginalised.

God's heart for justice is Christ-centred, community-shaped, compassion-driven and counter-cultural. To show justice is to live out God's mercy and truth.

Jesus inaugurated the Kingdom of God by quoting Isaiah 61 at the start of His ministry (Luke 4:18-19). Jesus fulfils the law and embodies justice (Matthew 5:17). He shows us what justice looks like in action through healing, forgiving, including, feeding. Jesus teaches that true religion must include justice, mercy and faithfulness (Matthew 23). Jesus' justice brings healing and wholeness to individuals by loving and restoring people.

Many other New Testament passages advocate justice.

1. Justice is love in action; caring for the marginalised is evidence of true spirituality (James 1:27).
2. Justice demands impartiality in treating all people with dignity (James 2:9).
3. Justice involves community care and radical generosity, just as the early church practised economic justice by redistributing wealth to meet needs (Acts 2:44-45).
4. Justice breaks down human barriers and includes all people (Galatians 3:28).
5. Justice includes empathy, peace-making and non-retaliation (Romans 12:15-18).

Old Testament justice is tied to covenant obedience and living as God's set apart people. New Testament justice is motivated by the cross. Jesus' sacrificial love creates a new community of justice and peace. We are empowered by Jesus' grace: justified through Jesus' righteousness to live out God's justice.

C. What Does Justice Look Like Today?

Justice transforms communities.

1. Personal: it starts with our hearts and homes, doing good with integrity and not to 'look good'. Justice is a mark of Christian maturity.
2. Communal: it reshapes how we live together. Justice calls us to live like Jesus especially in the way we treat the needy.

Here are some practical steps to show generosity

1. Personal generosity: with our resources, financially or emotionally.
2. Communal hospitality: inviting and including others.
3. Active advocacy: speak up for the marginalised, challenge unjust systems that perpetuate oppression.

We are saved by grace and sent to reflect Jesus' justice and compassion to all.

Biblical Justice 2: Where Does Justice Come From?

Rev Ian Lee | Deuteronomy 15:1-11; Luke 14:12-14

Summary | There are different moral principles of justice which guide decisions made by individuals, organisations, governments and nations. Some examples include:

A. Greatest good for the greatest number

- Approach: Maximising Welfare
- Focus: Consequences

B. The sanctity of every human life

- Approach: Respecting Freedom
- Focus: Individual autonomy

C. Upholding the good or virtuous life

- Approach: Promoting Virtue
- Focus: Moral character, society's values/end goals

Origins of Moral Principles of Justice

1. Justice doesn't come naturally

Many of us may think that the concept of justice is innate in humans or developed from logical thought. However, if we examine nature, we see that it is all about the survival of the fittest; the strong eating the weak.

Annie Dillard in her book *Pilgrim at Tinker Creek* observes the mating of praying mantises where the female mantises eat the male after mating:

"There is not a people in the world that behaves as badly as praying mantises. But wait, you say, there is no right and wrong in nature; right and wrong is a human concept. Precisely: we are moral creatures in an amoral world..."

If right and wrong is a human concept, then the principles of right and wrong are subjective – based only on what humans make of them at different time points and cultures, and not from a natural order. History is filled with examples of how human life is not valued equally.

"To believe that every human being possessed an equal dignity was not a self-evident truth. A Roman would have laughed at it. To campaign against discrimination on the grounds of gender or sexuality, however, was to depend on large numbers of people sharing in a common assumption: that everyone possessed an inherent worth." (Tom Holland, *Dominion*)

Instead, the basis of human rights is the equal and intrinsic value of every human being – because ALL human beings are made in the image of God. This is the bedrock of biblical justice.

2. Justice comes supernaturally – from God

When God called the Israelites out of Egypt, He set them apart to obey 'statutes and ordinances' that were 'just' and unlike other nations. By doing so, they would set themselves apart as a wise and discerning nation. (Deut 4:5-8) God's principles of justice valued each human life, especially the lowest in society.

For example, in Egypt, the Israelites were ill-treated as slaves and despised as foreigners. In contrast, God commanded the Israelites to be different and love the foreigner as they would their own fellow Israelite.

When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the Lord your God. (Levi 19:33-34)

Other examples of God's justice:

- On the seventh year
 - ♦ Cancellation of all debts and being generous to the poor (Deut 15:1-11)
 - ♦ Release of all slaves, and provide them with gifts (Deut 15:12-15)
- Land and vineyard owners should not completely harvest their crops but to leave enough for the needy and foreigner (Levi 19:9-10)
- Caring for and not oppressing widows, orphans, immigrants and poor; defending their cause and giving them food and clothing (Zech 7:9-10, Deut 10:17-18)

God's principles demand a radical inclusivity!

Justice is not the idea of humans. Justice is God's idea. It is His very nature!

This is what the Lord says: "Let not the wise boast of their wisdom or the strong boast of their strength or the rich boast of their riches, but let the one who boasts boast about this: that they have the understanding to know me, that I am the Lord, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight," declares the Lord. (Jer 9:23-24)

3. Justice comes by losing

Advocating for the poor and needy always comes with a cost. We are to use our resources/finances in ways that do not benefit us on earth. Jesus illustrates with the example of hosting a banquet. We should not invite those who can likely repay us. Instead, we are to invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and our payment will be in heaven (Luke 14:12-14).

Bruce Waltke, an Old Testament Professor, succinctly summarises what this looks like, as illustrated in the Book of Proverbs:

"The righteous are those who are willing to disadvantage themselves to the advantage of their community; the wicked are those who are willing to disadvantage the community to advantage themselves."

We are invited to embrace the loss, the cost of justice.

Jesus first set the example when he 'emptied himself' and took the 'form of a slave' and died on the cross for us (Phil 2:5-8).

4. From Justice comes flourishing

The Book of Ruth is a beautiful example of how Justice in action brings impactful goodness:

- Ruth chose to be faithful to Naomi, her mother-in-law, after the death of her husband and father-in-law. She chose to join Naomi in her poverty, becoming an immigrant in Israel (as a Moabite), without any patriarchal support (vulnerable).
- She was saved by Boaz who obeyed God's command to leave harvest in his fields for the poor.
- They get married and became part of the genealogy of David and Jesus!

We live in a broken world. Healing and justice come through the actions and sacrifices of individuals (people like you and me) who choose to do what is right. Let us consider God's call to biblical justice and 'let the same mind be in (us) that was in Christ Jesus' (Phil 2:5).

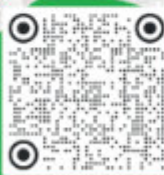

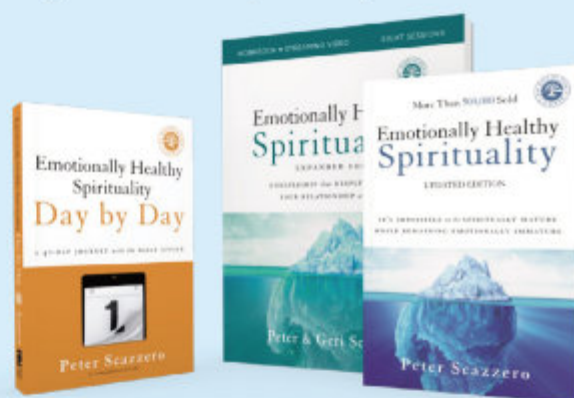

Psalm 91

Psalm 91 gives complete assurance of **God's Protection** and **Victory**, bringing **comfort, encouragement and peace** in life's difficult circumstances. However, it is fully applicable only to:

- Those who **dwell (abide)** in the shelter of the **Most High**. (v1,9)
- Those who put their **trust** in the **Lord God**. (v2)
- Those who **love** the **Lord God**. (v14)

A) Personal Faith in God: (1,2) The Hidden Life

Whoever (each individual) **dwells** (remains, lives with permanence... not occasional visits!) in the **shelter (secret place!)** of the Most High, will rest in the **shadow** of the Almighty. This implies an **intimate relationship with God!** He is so near that His shadow covers you, and nothing can reach you without passing through Him first. I will say of the LORD, "He is **my refuge** and **my fortress, my God** in whom **I trust**". The believer's proclamation ("**my**") is a statement of her/his **trust in God, who is characterised by: (1,2)**

The 4 Names of God: Most High (Elyon: Supreme, Sovereign);
 Almighty (El Shaddai: Powerful, All-sufficient);
 LORD (Jehovah: Faithful, Covenant relationship with us);
 God (Elohim: Creator, Plural: Father, Son, Spirit).

B) Confidence in Deliverance: (3,4) The Protected Life

Surely (Certainly!) God will **save** you from the **fowler's snare** (bird hunter's hidden traps: eg. scammers, disloyal/greedy relationships) and from the **deadly pestilence**. (eg. evident danger of SARS, COVID-19 pandemics)

He will cover you with his feathers and **under his wings** you will find refuge; his **faithfulness** will be your **shield** and **rampart**. The **powerful Creator** of the universe extends his tender, parental protection over you. (Jesus said: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, ... How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings. ...") (Matt 23:37)

God's faithfulness will provide complete protection for the whole body like a shield and the defensive wall of a city.

NB: This Psalm does **not** promise universal protection for all believers, in this fallen world, because they may be infected by epidemics/afflicted by suffering. The promise is not security "from", but "in" any affliction. (Rom 8:28) However, the believers who **abide** within the **will of God** are "**immortal**" and will be **preserved/kept safe**, until their task on Earth is done.

C) Result of God's Protection: (5,6)

Those who abide will **not fear**:

- The terror of **night** (eg. anxious thoughts, burglary, spiritual attacks...)
- The arrow that flies by **day** (eg. bad news, slander, bullying...)
- The pestilence that stalks in the **darkness** (eg. hidden infectious agents...)
- The plague that destroys at **midday** (eg. visible ravages of epidemics...)

NB: God's protection extends over the believers **all the time**, over your **bodies, mind, spirit!** (ie. night/day/darkness/midday).

D) Assurance for Believers: (7,8)

Though **1,000** may fall at your side and **10,000** at your right hand, **but it will not come near you**. In extremely risky situations, the believers are under the wings of the Almighty. He will **protect** them in accordance with His will and purposes. They come under the cover of **Jesus' blood** and redemption.

You will only observe with your eyes and **see the punishment of the wicked**.

(eg. The Israelites saw the destruction of the Egyptian firstborn while their firstborn were spared during the Passover, because of the **blood of the lamb** on their doorposts and lintels. They also saw the destruction of the Egyptian army in the Red Sea, while they remained safe. (Exod 12,14)

Wesley WSCS

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Prov 3:5-6 (NKJV)

E) Reiteration of Promise of Deliverance and Victory: (9-13)

IF: (a) You say: "The Lord is **my refuge**" and

(b) You make the Most High your **dwelling**. (Home! Not "hotel"!)(cf. v1)

Promise: (1) **No** harm will overtake you (ie. no evil will befall you)

(2) **No** disaster will come near your tent. (home, family, will be safe)

"**No**" indicates total/absolute safety. They are safe because of **God's Presence!**

Reason: (3) He will command his **angels**, to guard you in **all** your ways.(v11)*

(4) They will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.(v12)*

*These 2 verses (11,12) were quoted by Satan to tempt Jesus to throw himself down from the pinnacle of the Temple. (Matt 4:6) However, Jesus replied:

"You shall not put the Lord your God to the test." (Deu 6:16), because **God** had not told Jesus to do so!

*Elisha prayed and his servant's eyes were opened to see the **chariots of fire** upon the hills, protecting Elisha from the Syrian army. (2 Kings 6:17)

(5) You will trample on the lion(strong) and cobras/serpents (subtle). (You will be **victorious** over the lion/snakes which symbolise Satan.)

F) Blessings for Those Who Love God (14-16) The Fulfilled Life

Because she/he loves Me (clings to Me!) **says the Lord:** (God speaking!)

1. **I will rescue her/him** (God will act to deliver us from every oppression/mental health issue/illness/spiritual attack...)

2. **I will protect her/him**, for he/she **acknowledges** My Name. (God will protect us because of our allegiance to God/obedient lives. We may be unaware of incidences when He intervened to protect us!)

3. She/he will **call** on Me, and **I will answer her/him**. (Answered prayer!)

4. **I will be with her/him in trouble**. (God's Presence!) (God will not leave you at your point of need/in your pain!)

5. **I will deliver her/him and honour her/him**. (God will raise you up/vindicate/glorify you, His child/Jesus' co-heir!) Those who share in Christ's suffering, will also share in his inheritance. (John 1:12/Rom 8:17)

6. **With long life I will satisfy her/him and show her/him My salvation**. (eg. Abraham lived to a "good old age" and "full of years" - a fulfilled life, seen many descendants.)(Gen 25:8) Those who abide in God, will experience His Goodness, live within His Purposes, be blessed with Promises that extend to the Future. **Salvation** includes **healing** of body, mind, spirit, a transformed life, filled with His peace, and emotional/mental/physical well-being. **The Victorious Reign of God confers Healing Eternally!**

NB: 3 conditions: (1) Loves Me, (2) Acknowledges My Name: Lives obediently, (3) Calls on Me (Prays!).

Q1: Are you "dwelling" in the secret place daily or just visiting occasionally?

Q2: Are you seeking security in other things, and not in God alone? (eg. money, investments, education, human relationships, migration...)

Q3: Are there any fears you would like to commit in faith, to the Almighty?

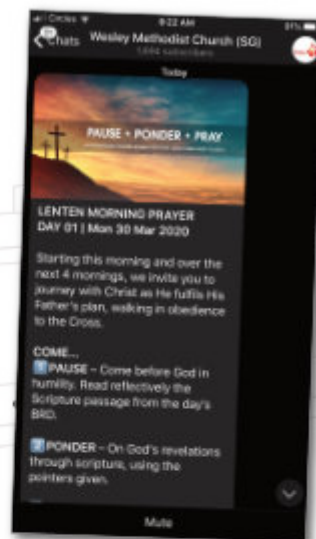
