Welcome To My Home!

Rev Lim Jen Huat | Luke 10:38-42

Summary | Jesus was traveling throughout the country. When He entered a certain village, Martha and Mary welcomed Him into their home.

Relationship with Jesus

We too may have heard about Jesus, but there comes a time when we know that He is here and at home with us. The apostle Paul described this as being in Christ – having a relationship with and maturing in Christ. (2Cor.5:17, Col. 1:27) It marks of our personal relationship with Jesus, when we welcome Him into our home.

Some people mistakenly believe that one can become a Christian by osmosis. Christianity will soak in when we are immersed long enough. But being in such a culture and environment (coming to church, taking Holy Communion regularly or studying in a mission school) does not make us Christians by osmosis. We also cannot become Christians by birth; based on our parents' faith. We can be born again Christians, but there is no such thing as being born Christians.

Each one of us must find faith and have a personal relationship with Christ. We need to welcome Jesus into our home, as Mary and Martha did. It is only when we have such a relationship with Jesus, that the sacraments have great significance for us. When Christ dwells in us, the sacraments become an outward and visible sign of the inward spiritual grace that we have.

Place of Jesus

For Martha, Jesus was primarily her guest. As the host, Martha was distracted and complained to Jesus. She asked whether Jesus was even bothered that her sister Mary did not help to do the work of making the preparations. In contrast, Mary sat at the Lord's feet and listened to Jesus. She was being tutored as His disciple (Acts 22:3) and submissively waited upon the Lord. (Lk.8:35) She sat at His feet and listened; while Martha, as the leader in her household, treated Jesus as her guest.

Who is Jesus when we invite Him into our house? Is Jesus merely a guest? Do we still run our lives, hold on to our dreams and ambitions and have the final say; or is Jesus the Lord and master over our lives, and we submit and obey. When Jesus is our Lord, His words are our command. They instruct and direct our ways.

Focus on Jesus

Mary was focused on Jesus, while Martha was distracted by many tasks, even though she called Jesus Lord. There was work that needed to be done and it was easy to get distracted. The issue is whether we are focused on the Lord. Jesus commended Mary, because although there were many things to do, she chose to wait on Jesus, listen and submit.

This is also our challenge. As a living sacrifice, we have many choices in daily living. We can easily be distracted and shift our focus away from Jesus. Do we resist the distractions and choose to serve the Lord? (Joshua 24:15) We can be easily distracted by the many values and attractions in the world. If we turn our focus away from Jesus, we will miss the will of God – that which is good, acceptable and perfect. It is not a one-time event that happens at our baptism. We need to run the race with perseverance because Jesus is the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.

What does it mean to be an intentional disciple of Jesus? It means that we have a personal relationship with Jesus. He is our Lord and Saviour and we constantly focus on Jesus and are not distracted by the world or the gods in our world.

Labouring For The Church

Rev Lilian Ang | Colossians 1:24-29

Summary | In this scripture passage Paul reminds us what it means to labour for the Church; not out of duty but from a place of deep devotion.

A. Labouring with Joy in The Midst of Suffering (v24)

Love transforms labour into joy. Paul, writing from prison, was willing to labour and even suffer indefatigably and joyfully for the Church. He knew that despite hardships and setbacks, every deed done for the Body of Christ was not in vain and was valuable in God's eyes.

When Paul spoke of filling up in his flesh what is still lacking in Christ's afflictions, he was not implying that there is anything still lacking. Christ has totally paid the price upon the cross and the work is complete. Afflictions refer to the pressures of life that Paul endured, of which he suffered more than most. But his sufferings gave courage to other believers to face their own persecutions. Paul was committed to take the Gospel to the gentiles and he paid a big price for his faithfulness. Often, we would like to escape suffering, but Paul counted it all pure joy. We are all called to serve Christ sacrificially as part of our discipleship journey. The Church has a role to be the hands and feet of Jesus to God's people and it can never succeed without our sacrificial service.

Where is God calling me to labour for the Church? Remember we follow a suffering Saviour! 1 Peter 4:3 tells us to rejoice as we participate in the sufferings of Christ so that we may be overjoyed when God's glory is revealed.

B. Labouring with A Steward's Mindset (v25)

Paul was entrusted with a sacred commission to take the Gospel to the gentiles and twice he refers to himself as a servant of the Gospel (v23) and a servant of the Church. (v24, 25)

Every believer is a steward, entrusted with opportunities, gifts and people. Let us ask God what He wants us to do with what He has given us.

C. Labouring to Reveal the Mystery of Christ (v26-27)

The content of the mystery is singular and it is Christ himself! It is Christ in us, the hope of glory! Most people need at least 5 or 6 encounters with Christ before they make the decision to accept Him. Our role is to help others see the light of Christ shining through their lives like light streaming through a stained-glass window, even the broken pieces.

D. Labouring with Purpose and Mission (v 28-29)

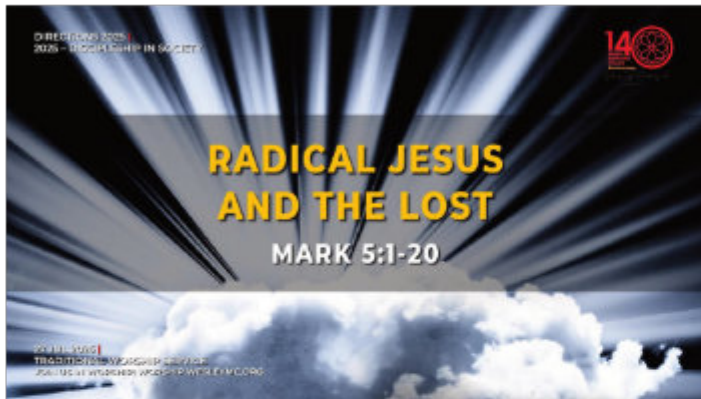
Paul's two-fold mission was to make the Word of God fully known (v25) and the people of God fully mature (v28). Many people may feel frustrated because they are not clear about their sense of purpose and mission. Our challenge is to ensure that Jesus reigns supreme in our lives and that we understand our mission and how we can fulfill it. This requires us to have a personal mission statement. Paul's personal mission statement is stated in v 28-29. Paul's mission was to fully dispense God's truth to lead every Christian to spiritual maturity. To this end he strenuously contended with all the extraordinary energy Christ gave him.

We have a big mission ahead of us to bring people to Christ and ensure that they grow as disciples. This requires much perseverance and the strength must come from Christ. We cannot do everything but we must do something. We must find out what God requires us to do and then do it with God's empowering. When we toil at a God given task we receive God given energy. The work of salvation is all of Christ and none of me but in order to live out our sacred mission it must be all of Christ and all of me.

2. Recall Sermon

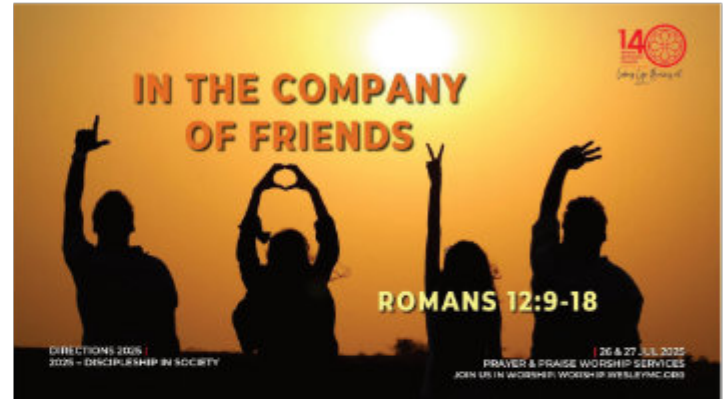
- Why is Outreach important?

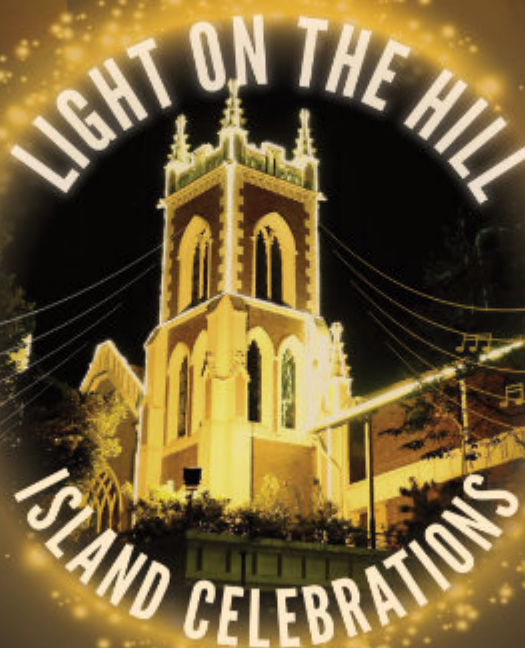

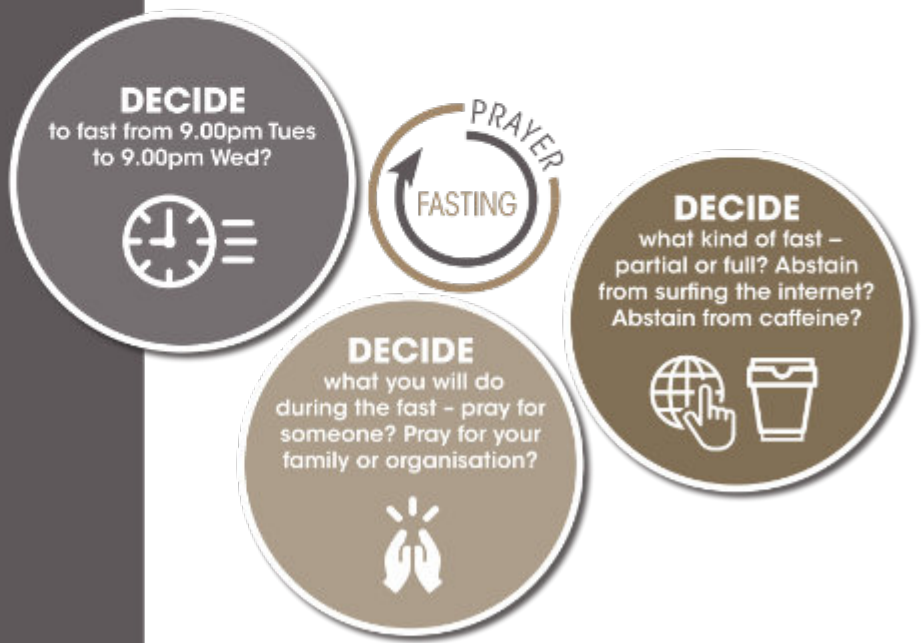

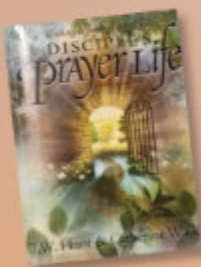

Psalm 139

This Psalm was written by King David. It expresses his praise, wonder and awe at **God's Knowledge, Presence and Power**. (ie. Omniscience: All-knowing/ Omnipresence: Present everywhere/ Omnipotence: All-powerful.)

It focuses on **God's relationship with each cherished "child" of God**. And ends with a prayer for the destruction of the wicked and the purification of the psalmist's own heart.

A) God Knows Everything about Us: (1-6)

1. You have **sought** me, Lord, and you **know** me.
2. You know when I **sit** and when I **rise**;
You **perceive** my thoughts from afar.
3. You **discern** my **going out** and my **lying down**;
You are familiar with **all my ways**.
4. Before a **word** is on my tongue,
You, Lord, **know it completely**.
5. You **hem** me in, behind and before, and you **lay your hand** upon me.
6. Such **knowledge** is too **wonderful** for me, too lofty for me to attain.

NB: God knows us intimately and (yet) He accepts and loves us!

He knows us perfectly and seeks to guide us. He discerns our:

1. **Actions** (when we sit, rise, feed the baby, change diapers, care for elderly parents/relatives, feed the hungry, connect with the lonely ...),
2. **Thoughts** (grateful/kind/unkind/vengeful/depressing/anxious/plans for dishonesty/immorality/retirement/job change/next holiday ...).
3. **Going out** (public life: to travel/socialise/work...with successful/happy appearance...)
4. **Lying down** (private life: resting in our homes... how we treat our spouses/helpers/children/siblings ...)
5. **All My Ways** (everything I do, how I behave... places I go to, the paths our lives have taken.)
6. **Words** (spoken or yet to be spoken, and our intention/ motives!)
7. **Hem** (God surrounds/encircles/guard us, as with a valuable object, for our protection.)
8. **Lay Your hand upon me** (He knows what is best for us and seeks to direct us.)

B) God Is Present with Us – All the Time. (7-12)

7. Where can I go from your **Spirit**?
Where can I flee from your **Presence**?
8. If I go up to the **heavens**, you are there;
If I make my bed in the **depths**, you are there.
9. If I rise on the wings of the **dawn**,
If I settle on the far side of the **sea**,
10. Even there your hand will **guide me**
Your right hand will **hold me fast**.
11. If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me
And the light become night around me,"
12. Even the darkness will not be dark to you;
The night will shine like the day,
For darkness is as light to you.

NB: (1) Even if we want to escape from Him, we cannot.

He is there: Up in the heavens, **down** in Sheol (the realm of the dead),

in the **East** with the dawn, flying to the distant **West**, of the Mediterranean Sea. **God is personally there**, to **guide us**, and **His strong right hand** will **support us**.

- (2) Even if we hope (or are afraid) that **darkness** will hide us from God, and the light around us turns **dark**, God will be there, because to God, the night shines as bright as day. **Nothing** shall separate us from the **Love of God!** (Rom 8:35)

C) God Created Us Wonderfully (13-18)

13. For you **created** my **inmost being**;
you **knit me together** in my mother's womb.
14. **I praise you** because I am **fearfully and wonderfully made**;
your works are **wonderful**, I know that full well.
15. My frame was **not hidden** from you
when I was made in the **secret place**,
when I was **woven together** in the depths of the earth.
16. **Your eyes** saw my **unformed body**;
all the days ordained for me were **written in your book**
before one of them came to be.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Prov 3:5-6 (NKJV)

17. How **precious** to me are your thoughts, God!
How **vast** is the sum of them!
18. Were I to count them,
they would outnumber the grains of sand –
when I awake, **I am still with you.**

NB: It was **God** who created/"knit" us, because it was **He** who designed the complex and intricate processes (encoded in the DNA) which formed the delicate, internal systems of each baby's body, during conception, gestation and human birth: A "**miracle**" (procreation, marvellous event) in which He has given women (and men) the privilege/joy of participating. **God saw us** (as embryo/foetus) when we were being "woven together" (Heb: "**embroidered**") in our mother's womb (before the ultrasound/sonogram was devised)! **Every day of our lives is recorded in His book** – even before we were born/our first day! How **precious** and **countless** are God's thoughts of each of us! God has a **special interest** in each of us. When we **awake** from sleep/upon entry to Eternity, we discover that **God is still there with us!**

NB: We are made in **God's image** and He has a **special purpose** for each person who is born. His interest in each embryo/fertilised ovum indicates her/his value **in the eyes of our Creator**. Surely, abortion:

- 1) Deprives the unborn baby of his/her **right to life?** (**which each of us is blessed with!**) ("Speak for those who cannot speak for themselves. . ." Prov 31:8)
- 2) Deprives society of a **precious baby/a new citizen!** (eg. a future doctor, nurse, scientist, CEO, homemaker, teacher, singer. . . . **A baby for childless couples** waiting for adoption or a **loving, caring daughter/son for "Mom".**)

D) May God Judge the Wicked and Purify My heart (19-24)

19. If only you, God, would slay the **wicked!**
Away from me, you who are bloodthirsty!
20. They speak of **you** with evil intent;
your adversaries misuse your name.
21. Do I not hate those who hate **you**, Lord,
and abhor those who are in **rebellion against you?**
22. I have nothing but hatred for them;
I count them **my enemies.**
23. **Search me**, God, and **know** my heart;
test me and know my anxious thoughts.
24. See if there is any offensive way **in me**,
and lead me in the way everlasting.

NB: (1) David had endured many life-threatening situations. He had many enemies. However, here he appealed to his Righteous God to punish the **violent wicked, who rebelled against God and blasphemed His name**. David considered these, his enemies as well.

- (2) David ended this Psalm by asking God to **search** and **know** his heart (as in v1), to test him, identify anxieties and anything which offends Him, so that he may seek forgiveness, **purify his own life**, so that God may lead him to a righteous, everlasting life. **This is the way of Holiness and Humility for all followers of Christ as well.**

Q1. Have you asked God to identify any offensive thought, word or deed, in your life, so that you may repent, seek cleansing through Jesus' blood and live a holy and humble life?

Q2. Have you praised and thanked Him for His Loving Presence and acceptance, despite knowing you so intimately, with all your imperfections?

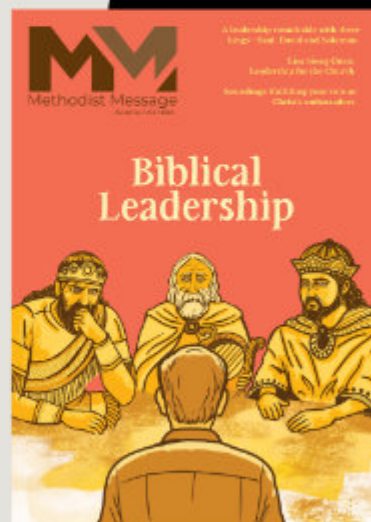

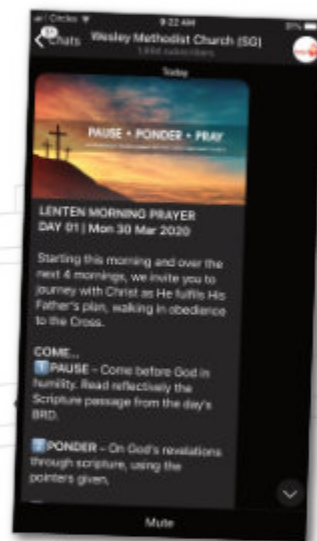
